## Bleed Kits

Mike Dowson has very kindly donated a bleed kit to the parish in the defibrillator cabinet outside the village hall. They work in the same way as the defibrillator in that you phone 999 to get access and be supported with use.

## Planning

**Application: WND/2022/0434. 1 John Campbell Close.**

Construction of a single storey annexe. The Council object to this application as it is inappropriate in terms of scale and proportion and not in- keeping with the Neighbourhood Plan.

**Application: WND/2022/0453. 34 Sutton Street.** Rebuild and heighten the brick chimney. The Council has no objections to this application as it conforms to the Neighbourhood Plan

**Application: WND2022/0455. 4 Champion Fields Way.** Conversion of detached garage to self- contained annexe. The Council has no objections to this application as it does not affect the street scene and conforms to the Neighbourhood Plan

## Hillside Road

Unitary Cllr Morton met with Highways personnel who have agreed to include the section of Hillside road from the water tower to Collins far, as part of their responsibility and will tarmac and repair as necessary.

## Fly Tipping

In recent years we have seen a big increase in the number of incidents of fly-tipping in the lanes and roads around Flore. The items which have been tipped have generally fallen into five different categories -

- Tyres
- Cannabis hydroponics farming paraphernalia
- White goods (and especially fridges and freezers)
- Household items such as sofas, beds and other furniture
- Builders rubble and waste.

The reasons for these things being tipped vary.

Tyre businesses charge customers to dispose of the old tyres from vehicles because the government charges the business a levy to dispose of them properly. A dishonest tyre company will charge the customer the levy and then dump the old tyres and keep the levy money.

Similarly, the government charges money to dispose of fridges and freezers, specifically because they need the refrigerant taken out of them before they are disposed of. Again, dealers will offer to dispose of the old fridge or freezer "properly" and then dump it.

Builders are charged by civic amenity tips for disposing of "trade waste" so it's cheaper to dump it.

Household items like furniture, etc? Just sheer laziness in most cases.

Cannabis farms - well, the reason behind that is obvious.

Fly-tippers like to find a quiet secluded location, especially at night-time, to do their dumping. Some of the lanes around Flore are ideal for their purposes. There is no CCTV, the roads are very quiet at night and perhaps most importantly if a car or other vehicle does start to approach it can be

seen coming at night a long way off; sufficient time to close up the van or drop the tipper body and get away.
